


Operational reform cont'd

- Migration of all IT systems to Microsoft 365 to ensure good governance and operational continuity:
 - OIU email accounts for all committee members
 - Chat transferred to Teams environment
 - Digital document management system in One Drive
- Operating model
 - Managing and respecting people's time share the load to attract and retain volunteers
 - Meetings fixed schedule, agenda, pre-reading
 - Strategic priorities 2-year focus (i.e. Budget and people resource) on specific priorities, re-evaluated with appointment of new President
- Refinement in investment approach: all subscriptions retained in base, only spend investment income

A safe and welcoming "Home" that provides respite from sleeping rough.

- An overnight shelter for the Homeless
- Provide a safe and home-like atmosphere for those in need, especially those most vulnerable.
- Established in May 2023, to replace Teresa House following its closure in 2020.
- Opens every Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday night.
- Hosted almost 1000 guests and provided almost 2000 meals.
- A safe and welcoming "Home" that provides respite from sleeping rough.



- Oldest left in 1944 (John Brown, ~95)




The overwhelming majority of respondents are more than satisfied with the OIU's initiatives and activities

On a scale of 0 to 10, how satisfied are you with the activities and initiatives undertaken by the OIU?




- 837 respondents

- Useful as a benchmark relative to interest in OIU activities ...




Q: On a scale of 0 to 10, how satisfied are you with the activities and initiatives undertaken by the OIU?


